EQUALITY of status and of opportunity and to promote among them all

FRATERNITY assuring the dignity of the individual and the unity and integrity of the Nation;

IN OUR CONSTITUENT ASSEMBLY this twenty-sixth day of November, 1949, do HEREBY ADOPT, ENACTAND GIVE TO OURSELVES THIS CONSTITUTION.

ADMISSION SCHEDULE:

- (a) Submission of Admission Forms to UG.-1st Year on Merit bases:03-06-2024 to 15-07-2024. (No admission form will be entertained after this in any case except there is statutory admission)
 - (b) Admission to 2nd& 3rdYear (Roll on basis): 06-06-2024 to 15-07-2024.

ADMISSION UNDER CBCS (UGC):

The Govt. of Himachal Pradesh has introduced Choice Based Credit System under UGC and these regulations have been called the HPU Regulations for CBCS and Continuous Assessment Grading Pattern (CAGP) for UG Programs.

DEFINITIONS:

Credit: It is a method/unit to measure the volume of the content, learning effort, achievement of learning and weight age of the course. The term credit refers to the weightage given to a course usually. In terms of instructional hours per week assigned to it for the purpose of credit determination. One lecture or tutorial of one hour a week and practical of two hours a week is considered as one credit. The total minimum credits required for an undergraduate degree programme i.e.

B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.(annual system) 132.

Tutorial Session Consists of participatory discussion/desk work/ problem solving/ brief seminar on a topic or any such other novel method that makes learners absorb and assimilate more effectively the contents delivered in a lecture session. Normally, the tutorial sheets prepared by the teacher are distributed in advance to help learner prepare for interaction systematically.

Practical / **Practice** session consists of hands-on experience/ laboratory experiments/ Field Studies/Case studies that equip students to acquire the much-required skill component

Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA): Continuous comprehensive assessment shall be carried out in the form of quizzes, assignments, group discussions, seminars, 1 class test/house exam and annual examination and shall be reflected in the syllabi for a course of study.

<u>Course Offered in the College:</u> B.A. with Core Course-I in various subjects; B.Sc. with Core Course-I in various subjects and B.Com. with Core Course-I in Commerce.

Eligibility for Admission:

A student pass in the Senior Secondary (+2) Examination (Academic Stream) conducted by the H.P
Board of School Education (or in case of Shashtri, pass in PrakShashtri from Sanskrit Colleges
affiliated to the HPU) or an examination accepted as equivalent thereto by the various bodies of
the

H.P. University.

- a. Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with science stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Sc. programme.
- b. Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with commerce stream
 - shall be given preference in admission to B.Com. programme.
- 2. An applicant should not be more than 23 years of age (25 years for girl students only) as on 01/07/2024. The upper age limit is raised to 26 years for SC and ST applicants. However, in case of

- overage applicant, the Vice Chancellor, SPU University may allow a relaxation up to 6 months.
- 3. An applicant having passed 10+2 examination with English as one of the compulsory subjects from any Board/University recognized by H.P Govt. or H.P. University or Association of Indian Universities can seek admission.
- 4. Admission is also open to an applicant who has an equivalent degree from Foreign University/
 Board/College which is recognized by H.P. Govt. or H.P. University or Association of Indian
 Universities provided the applicant fulfils the minimum eligibility conditions.
- Admission of a student is liable to be cancelled in case he/she furnishes incomplete/wrong/false
 information or in case of concealment of facts. Disciplinary action will also be taken against such
 candidate.
- 6. Initially all admission shall be provisional and subject to the final approval by H.P. University.
- 7. Rules of admission are subject to change as per the H.P. University notifications issued from timeto time.
- 8. Admission to the various classes will be made on the recommendation of the admission committee constituted for the purpose.
- 9. Any gap of one year or more in the academic career of an applicant must be supported by documentary evidence/affidavit as the proof of his/her activities during the period of gap. Submission of false affidavit is a legal offence.
- 10. The applicant must fill up the Application Form in his/her handwriting and get it signed by his/her parents/local guardian.
- 11. The Application Form must be completed in all respects along with the following documents:
 - a. Self Attested copies of detailed marks card of the previous examinations passed. In case of non- receipt of this certificate, the applicant must attach the certificate issued by the Head of the Institution last attended.
 - b. Self Attested copy of Matriculation certificate for verification of date of birth.
 - c. Original Character certificate from the institution last attended.
 - d. Self Attested copy of Aadhar Card.
 - e. Bonafide Himachali Certificate in case of Girls candidates.
 - f. Every applicant must fill an Anti Ragging Undertaking online on the link http://www.antigagging.in of UGC
- 12. Applicant must produce original certificates at the time of admission.
- 13. Applicant coming from Boards/Universities other than H.P Board of School Education

Dharamshala/H.P. University Shimla must provide migration certificate in original.

14. Persons with Disability (PwD) applicant seeking fee concession must furnish their status certificatenot less than 40 % disability from Medical Board.

RULES OF REFUSAL OF ADMISSION

- 1. Applicants who have passed intermediate from Hindi Sahitya Samelan, Allahabad or Prabhakar arenot eligible for admission in the first Year for three-year degree course. However the admission can be done if allowed by DHE/SPU Mandi (HP).
- 2. Any candidate who passed his/her 10+2 examination after the month of July every year is noteligible to take admission in 1st year in that particular year.
- 3. Any candidate who appeared in or passed his/her 10+2 examination without English as a subjectshall not be eligible for admission in first year for three-year degree course.
- 4. In spite of the eligibility for admission, the Principal can refuse admission if the conduct of thestudent has not been up to the mark during the previous years.
- 5. The Principal reserves the right to disallow or cancel any admission without assigning any reasons.

MIGRATION:

The migration of students migrating during the same course/session from any affiliated college or institution (including ICDEOL) to another affiliated college or institution shall be governed by the regulations framed by the Executive Council of the University from time to time.

Choosing Programme Study Courses in CBCS under UGC:

- At the time of admission each student will identify a Core course -I(main) subject in which he/she will concentrate and two other core courses-II & III (allied) subjects, which he/she would choose to study.
- 2. <u>Core course –I once identified would not be changed unless the student quits a programme and</u> joins a new programme.
- 3. Core courses-II & III, on the other hand, would be the subjects that would be chosen by the student out of a number of subject combinations (at least two subjects) suggested and approved by the UG BOS and Faculty and these courses should be available in the college/institution in which student applies for admission.
- 4. In these courses the student will be required to accumulate a certain minimum number of

credits in order to qualify for the UG degree.

For the Degree:

- 1. A regular candidate shall have to undergo the prescribed courses of study in a College for a period not less than three academic sessions (and not more than five academic sessions), should have passed the examinations prescribed and fulfill such conditions as have been prescribed there for.
- 2. For the degree (B.A. / B. Sc. / B.Com.) the student will have to cumulate a minimum 132 successful credit hours of coursework over a minimum of three and a maximum of five years from the date of admission, provided that not more than three attempts will be allowed to pass a course.
- 3. The minimum pass marks for all the courses in CBCS (UGC) system for both CCA and ESE/ Annual Exams (A.E.) will be 35per cent in each and 40 per cent in aggregate.

Duration (Time Frame):

The UG (TDC) programme for a regular student shall be for a minimum period of three years and a maximum of five years from the date of admission of the candidate. There shall be in each session not less than 180 working days with 1080 teaching clock hours (each working day having 6 teaching clock hours).

- IV. Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Courses- (IIIrd Year= 04 papers for Arts & Comm.and 06 papers for Science).
- V. Generic Elective Courses (GEC)-(IIIrd year = 02 papers only for Arts & comm.).

Accumulation of Credits:

A student must accumulate 132 credits for new pattern for the award of a UG degree.

Evaluation: Evaluation system has the following two components:

- I. Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA):-It will account for 30% of the final grade in a phased manner.
 - a. Class Room Attendance: A student has to attend a minimum of 75 percent

lectures/tutorials and practical failing which he/she will not be allowed to appear in ESE. The incentive for classroom attendance:-

75% but <80% 1 mark 80% but <85% 2 marks 85% but <90% 3 marks 90% but <95% 4 marks Above 95% 5 marks

- b. **House Exams (HE):** There will be one HE in each year and it will be of 15 marks for Science and 10 marks for Arts and commerce for all Years.
- c. Class Test(CT): There will be one class test for Arts and Commerce of 05 marks in each year.
- d. **Seminar / Assignment / Quiz/Project** –The remaining 10 marks of the CCA will be awarded on the basis of class test/ seminar / assignment / quiz /projector fill work etc.
- II. Annual Exams (AE): The remaining 70 percent of the final grade of the student in a course will be on the basis of annual exams (AE) that will be for three hours duration and will be covering thewhole syllabus of the course.

Grading:

- Credit Weighed Marking System: Performance of a student is evaluated in terms of earned
 credit weighed marking system. Earned credits are defined as the sum of course credits in
 which grade points above a certain cut off have been obtained for declaring learner pass in
 that course. In this way two performance indices emerge
- Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) for the current semester which is calculated on the basis of grade points obtained in all courses, except audit courses and courses in which satisfactory or course continuation has been awarded. SGPA= Points secured in the semester / (credits registered in the semester excluding audit, satisfactory courses and course continuation courses).
- Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) for the student is calculated on the basis of all
 pass grades obtained in all courses, except audit courses and courses in which satisfactory
 or course continuation has been awarded, obtained in all completed semesters
- CGPA = Σ(course credits earned (Ci)x Grade points (Gi)) over all semesters / Σ(Total course credits (Ci in all the semesters except satisfactory, audit credits or course continuation credits) Or CGPA = cumulative Points secured in all passed courses / (Cumulative earned credits excluding audit, satisfactory courses and course continuation courses).
- Calculation of Grades for SGPA and CGPA The marks obtained in the CCA and the ESE will be

combined and used for the deciding of the course grade that the student will be getting. Grading will be done by the Office of the COE HPU for each course class and the grades will be assigned to the students in the class as follows:

Determining GPA, SGPA and CGPA, Division and Merit positions for Medals etc. For each student the Grade Point Average (GPA) and the Cumulated Grade Point Average (CGPA)will be determined by the CoE office of the HPU as follows: SGPA= $(\Sigma CiGi) / (\Sigma Ci)$ Where i issummed over the number of courses studied in the current semester. GPA or $CGPA = (\Sigma CiGi) / (\Sigma Ci)$, Where i here is summed over the number of courses studied in the past semesters as well ascurrent semester. Where, Ci is the credit earned for course i (i varying from 1 to n) and Ci is the grade point obtained by the student in course i (i varying from 1 to n), n being the number of courses passed so far by a student.

- Any instance of ragging should immediately be brought in the notice of members of anti-ragging squad/committee.
- Go through the college notice board daily.
- Smoking or taking of intoxicants, liquor etc. is strictly prohibited in the college campus.
- Every student should know that this college is "No Intoxication Zone".
- ❖ Use of Mobile Phone is strictly prohibited in the college premises, if any student found using mobile will be fined Rs. 100/-
